arols by Candlelight will feature a star-studded line-up of some of Australia's best and brightest talent, however there are also some remarkable Australians who will be present behind the scenes.

Nikki Hind, the nation's first blind fashion designer and

Vision Australia client, will be one of them in attendance on the night.

In October, Vision Australia partnered with Nikki to release the final instalment in the Big Visions series Dressed for Success, which follows Nikki's journey as a designer.

Each book aims to alter people's expectations of what a person with disability is capable of, while also creating inspiring role models for children of all abilities.



"One of the most common questions a child is asked is what they want to be when they grow up. However, this same question is rarely posed to a child with disability due to an assumption that they cannot achieve the same goals as their peers," Vision Australia library services business manager Vildana Praljak said. Nikki is a prime example of being told 'no' by people in

her life due to her vision loss.

"Many doors that had been previously open for me were slammed shut," Nikki said. "However, I thought back to how fashion made me feel as a child; it gave me a sense of purpose. That's a feeling I wanted to reclaim, so I decided to pursue fashion design despite what other people told me.

"Through this book, I want children of all abilities to know that they should dream big and go after their dreams, irrelevant of

Embracing a life without limits

Lucy's challenging journey: From uncertainty to a hopeful future

ucy Preston is a smart and cheerful three-year-old whose smile lights up any room she is in.

In the first three months of Lucy's life, she endured numerous tests and medical appointments due to her premature birth, all while glaucoma remained hidden beneath the surface as an unexpected culprit.

Denise, Lucy's mother, is a professional known for her clinical and rational approach to life's challenges.

However, when she was faced with the diagnosis of the mystery condition affecting her daughter, even her logical mindset was shaken.

"From a mum's perspective, you emotionally wonder what you did wrong, even though you objectively know you didn't do anything wrong," Denise said.

"That was difficult to rationalise. In my work, I am incredibly rational and objective, but emotions can get the better of you.

During those initial months, glaucoma was the last thing on anyone's mind. Tests were conducted to rule out other conditions and diagnoses, simply because glaucoma is exceptionally rare in children

When glaucoma was finally diagnosed. Lucy was booked in for immediate eye corrective surgery.

The procedures were successful, but in that moment, Denise remembers it feeling like a whirlwind of uncertainty.

Although they finally had the diagnosis, they didn't know

what this meant for Lucy's future and vision.

During this challenging time, Denise was encouraged to contact Vision Australia, which became a pivotal support system for Lucy and her family.

Lucy started occupational therapy and quickly began to showcase her remarkable abilities and resilience, often surprising her parents.

Nevertheless, they continued to face their share of challenges. one of the most significant being the delicate balance between assisting Lucy and letting her explore new situations independently.

is not really knowing what Lucy can see until she can tell us, and working out what she needs help with and what we need to allow her to learn on her own without coddling her." Denise said.

"There's still that need for her to make mistakes she can learn from."

Thanks to Lucy's supportive parents Denise and Aaron and Vision Australia's involvement, Lucy's future now looks bright.

She adores reading her Feelix Library books, which have braille overlay or an audio recording, and finds immense joy in song play music groups.

Lucy is also working on goals to enhance her fine and gross motor skills, ensuring she can keep up with her peers.

Christmas is special for Lucy's family. It is a time of celebration, a moment for reflection and a time to express gratitude.

When Alfie was just three, doctors discovered a brain tumour affecting his optic nerves, leading to major surgery and a diagnosis of optic atrophy, blurring his vision and limiting his left eye's movement.

It was a scary time for mum Cherish. "I was devastated in the beginning, and very scared for what the future would bring," she said.

But Alfie's boundless happiness and perseverance is like a beacon of hope for Cherish, and she knows they can tackle anything together.

Alfie is an energetic go-getter. He loves

superheroes and dreams of becoming a police officer to catch "the bad guys".

When he's not fighting crime in his imagination, he's having fun playing games with his little sister Charlie

Through Vision Australia, Alfie receives orientation and mobility support and training from specialist Michael Evans and also sees family support practitioner Sharon Chen.

Working with Vision Australia has boosted Alfie's confidence and Michael has worked closely with his school to help him thrive and ensure that no obstacles get in the way of his development.

Cherish speaks highly of the not-for-profit organisator and is so grateful for their ongoing support. Her No.1 priority is for Alfie to maintain his independence and stay

"I just want him to be able to do whatever he wants to do," she said.

"As long as he's confident and happy, then I'm happy.



A little fighter with a big road ahead

ui Carroll's journey began when he was born prematurely. From the very start, his parents knew he was a small baby, and the prospect of the neonatal intensive care unit became a reality.

For the first three days of his life, Lui kept one eye closed, leaving his family in suspense. It wasn't until a week later that his other eye slowly began to open.

With time, it gradually revealed more of the world around him. However, the road ahead was not without its challenges, as Lui, now two, was eventually diagnosed with severe right congenital ptosis.

While medical experts continued to investigate the cause of his condition, Lui's mother Danielle knew her son was a fighter.

She recalls those initial days of concern. "I was really worried he wouldn't be able to open his eyes at all in the first few days," she said.

"He's a small little fighter that tackles things in his own way."

Lui's ophthalmologist recommended the family seek assistance from Vision Australia.

Over time, Lui has received care from speech therapists and physiotherapists, and they have helped the family navigate the National Disability Insurance Scheme.

With Lui facing developmental delays, the family are united in their efforts to ensure he stays on track with his milestones.

Despite the challenges, Lui refuses to let his condition slow him down. He finds joy in spending time in the shed, his

Matchbox cars and he's formed a special bond with their dog Carlos.

The future remains uncertain in terms of Lui's vision, but for now, his family is committed to enhancing his communication skills and physical therapy to help him overcome any obstacles that may come his way.

"While those milestones may take longer to achieve, I'm sure Lui will get there," Danielle said.

"I just want him to have a happy, fulfilling life. And be grateful for what we have."

As Christmas approaches, the family comes together to celebrate the joy of having one

"It's family time and for me it's important that we all come together and celebrate having each other," Danielle said.

lead an independent future. Founded on the belief that all children should be given the same opportunities to learn and grow into an independent adult, the Life Ready program allows children and young people who are blind or have low vision to succeed.

In Australia, just 24 per cent of people who are blind or have low vision are in full-time employment, below comparable countries such as Canada (28 per cent) and New Zealand (32 per cent).

The Life Ready program aims to tackle this in Australia by helping children, young people and families build their skills across nine life skill areas, according to Vision Australia chief executive officer Ron Hooton.

"We understand that every child is unique in how they interact and learn in the world around them." Ron said. "Much of what we learn is through what we see, so children who are blind or have low vision will gather information in different ways."

"By using a coaching approach, participants learn how to move around their environments, use technology to access print, build relationships, have fun, advocate for themselves or start thinking about future jobs."

"We do our best to set them up for success so they can live the life they choose."

Ron adds: "While some skill areas are universal for all children, others are specifically for children who are blind or have low vision. When combined, they help a child

or young person prepare for an independent future."

Life Ready is delivered by a team of paediatric experts across the stages of early years, primary school and high school. Participants can join the program at any time until the age of 25.

"Program participants are connected with other children, young people and families, and our team of experts, to build their confidence, develop critical life skills and, most importantly, feel supported by a community," Ron said.



"AAMI's commitment to Vision Australia is not just seasonal; it's an ongoing partnership that reflects our dedication to making a positive impact in the community," Mim said.


